CASE No 10

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A 26 y.o. male was transferred to our medical center following episodes of generalized tonic-clonic seizures experienced during hospitalisation at a psychiatric hospital for treatment of a severe panic attack. He was known at our center, as he was undergoing investigation for a myoclonic epilepsy syndrome. During the current hospitalisation, the patient presented uncontrollable seizures and myoclonias initially focalized to the right upper extremity progressing to diffuse distribution. MRI was within normal limits and EEG demonstrated anomalies consistent with multifocal epileptic discharges. Clinically the patient progressed to status epilepticus and passed away shortly there after.
