This position will involve sign-out duties in neuropathology, autopsy, resident training activities, and participation in one or more clinical conferences. Jefferson Pathology has an ACGME accredited residency program and subspecialty fellowships.

The candidate will be mainly responsible for diagnostic consultation on neuropathology service; clinical duties will also involve Autopsy Pathology.

Candidates experienced in the application of diagnostic molecular pathology and a record of academic productivity will be given preference. Board certification or eligibility in Anatomic Pathology and Neuropathology are required. The candidate must hold or be eligible for an unrestricted Pennsylvania license.

The successful candidate will be expected to be a member of the Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University teaching faculty and time will be allocated to pursue the intradepartmental and interdepartmental opportunities for independent and/or translational research.
